This letter is coming to you with updates from the "Give Ye Them To Eat" program. The summertime ministries at the "Tree of Life" Training Center in Tlancualpican had the energetic GYTTE staff hopping! June, July and August were primarily dedicated to workshops and guided tours, etc., when our brothers and sisters in Mexico were better able to take advantage of all that the training center has to offer as well being able to withstand the summer heat in Tlancualpican! And, the summer record was broken once again, not only by the heat index but, more importantly, by the number served, 242 people in all!!!

#### DURING THE SUMMER 2013 THE STAFF LED:

#### Seven Workshops and Courses



✓ A Workshop on the materials GYTTE produced for Vacation Bible School [50 participants]



✓ A Workshop on the Dehydration of Fruits and Vegetables for food security [25 participants]



✓ A Workshop on the Processing of Recycled Paper for handicrafts [26 participants]



✓ A Vermiculture Workshop (Worm farming) to generate nutrient-rich organic fertilizer) [3 participants]



 A Workshop on the Construction of Solar Ovens for zero-cost cooking (the construction materials used are cardboard boxes, aluminum foil, newspapers and a sheet of windowpane glass [19 participants]



✓ A Course on Pajarcilla Construction (Pajarcilla is a traditional building technique using hand formed lumps of earth mixed with straw.) [21 students from a vocational school in the nearby town of Axochiapan]



✓ A Course on Natural Paints for houses, using plants and soils of various types and colors [21 participants]



#### Five Guided Tours of the Training Center



✓ Demonstrating the 6 different ministry areas and the appropriate technologies used and taught at the Center [a total of 77 participants who also enjoyed the "by-product" of homemade ice cream and yogurt made from goat's milk as well as snacks cooked in the Solar Oven]

#### A New....Old Technology for the Training Center



✓ Construction of a small dam to use with an old type of pumping system, a water-wheel! The Water Wheel was purchased and donated by the Rotary Foundation.

#### ADDITIONAL BLESSINGS:

To add to the excitement, our Brown Swiss Cow had a female calf! That means more yogurt, more ice cream, more cheese, and more outreach through the Livestock Development ministry.

#### UPCOMING EVENTS WE'LL BE SHARING IN FUTURE UPDATES:

- $\Rightarrow$  A Grant from Rotary International will fund equipment purchases for additional technologies.
- ⇒ The Advanced Health Course [the third and final one!] for the current class of Primary, Community-based Healthcare Workers is scheduled for this fall.
- ⇒ Classes, courses, workshops, retreats and guided tours will be scheduled as churches, schools and village groups request these activities.
- ⇒ The 2014 Calendar is filling up, with January and February scheduled for two AWARE Teams from Tennessee (Belmont and Brentwood UMC) and Indiana (Simpson UMC).
- ⇒ Winter 2014 is when the students from the Baez Camargo Methodist Seminary in Mexico City will exchange their city life for a week of rural reality at the Center to learn low-tech practices and how to teach them to others.
